CHARLESTON, IL--"Corridor Development--Opportunities Unlimited" is the theme of the third annual economic development conference at the Mattoon Holiday Inn on Thursday, May 21.

Speakers include Robert Ady, Executive Vice President and Director of the Chicago office of the Fantus Company; and Daniel E. Marvin, Jr., President of the East Central Illinois Development Corporation and President of the First National Bank of Mattoon.
