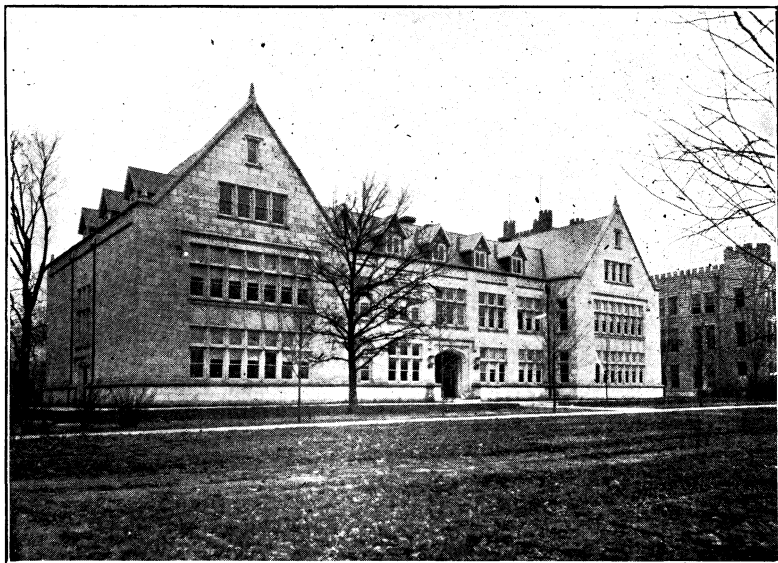
Lectures on Education.
