CHARLESTON--Outstanding seniors from six area high schools will give presentations on the topic "What is high school giving me? What does the university expect from me?" at 7 p.m. Wednesday, April 25 in the Buzzard Building Auditorium at Eastern Illinois University.

The presentations are part of a special forum sponsored by the Department of Secondary Education and Foundations and College of Education.

Dr. Ron Gholson, Associate Professor of Secondary Education, said the forum is the department's contribution to the pre-inaugural celebration for Eastern President Stanley G. Rives.

Gholson also said the forum will be of value to Eastern students and faculty by sharing the point of view of the student preparing to enter a university. He said prospective and active teachers will benefit the most, but everyone should be able to enjoy the event.

The six students who will speak are Rebecca Gerlach of Central High School (Champaign); Carmen Armillas of Charleston High School; Vivian Vahling of Mattoon High School; Cary Bonnell of Oblong High School; Dan Lynch of Paris High School; and Julie Schaljo of Sullivan High School.

The students are free to address any aspect of the overall theme and are expected to speak for about 10 minutes each.

President Rives will make a brief response to the students at the conclusion of the presentations. There is no admission charge.
