SPRINGFIELD, IL-- The appointment of Dr. Douglas B. Bock as Chairman of the Department of Speech-Communications at Eastern Illinois University was approved by the Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities at its meeting here Thursday.

President Daniel E. Marvin, Jr. said the Board's approval was necessary because Bock was granted tenure in the Department. Bock, who will hold the rank of Professor, will assume the position on Aug. 23.

Bock currently is an Associate Professor in the Department of Communication at Utah (Logan) State University. He has a Master of Arts degree and the Ph.D. from Southern Illinois University and a bachelor's degree from Bradley University.

He began his professional career as a teacher at Richwoods Community High School in Peoria and later taught at Southern, Auburn, the University of Florida and Texas Christian University. Bock joined the Utah faculty in 1979.

His administrative experience includes Graduate Program Coordinator at Utah State, Director of the Basic Communications Course at Texas Christian, and Chairman, Speech Department Budget Committee and Coordinator of Undergraduate Studies at the University of Florida.
