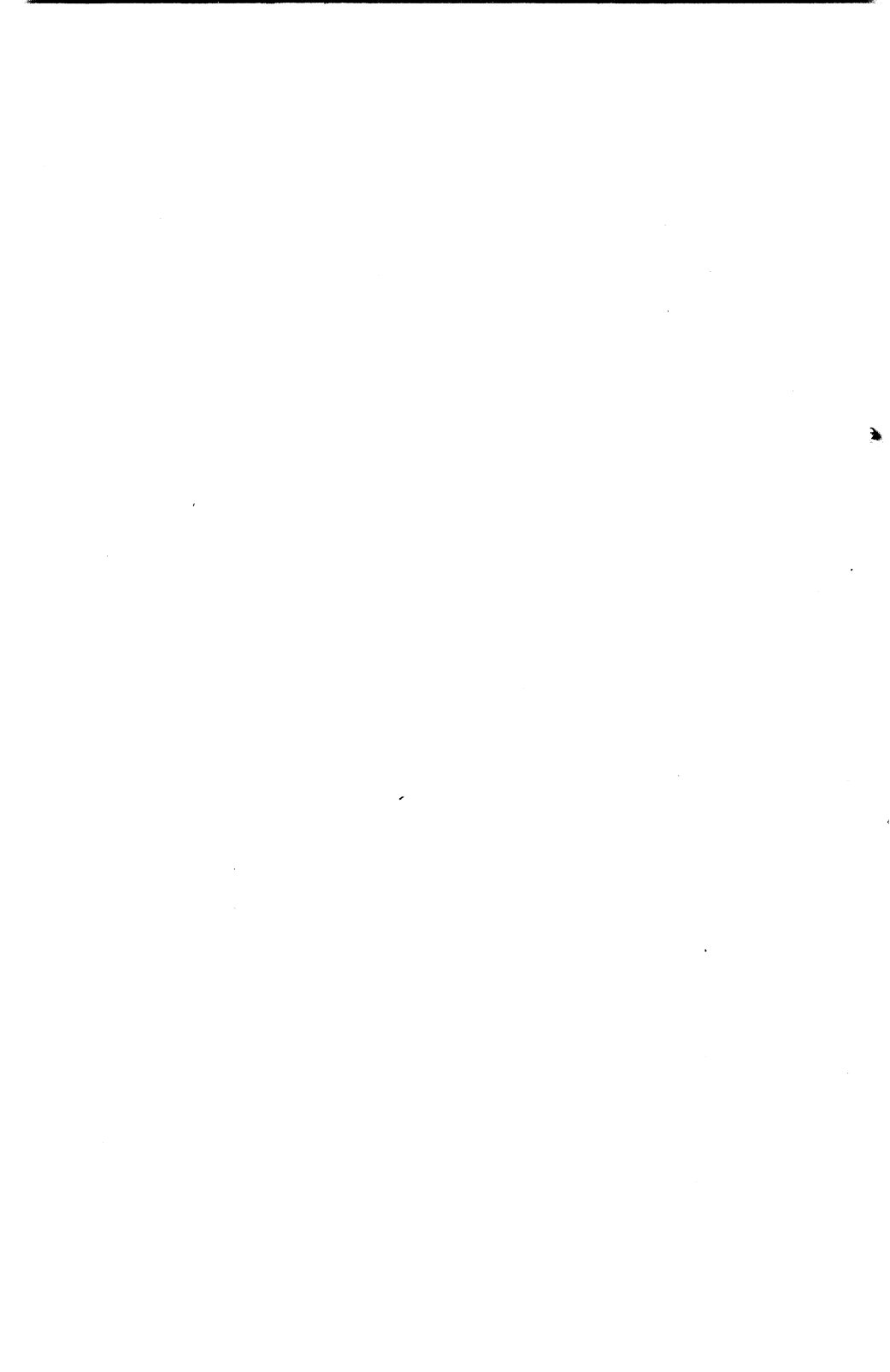

## PREFACE

The aim in compiling this list has been to provide for small and for medium sized libraries a selected list of material that will prove of use in supplementing at small expense the books and magazines already on the shelves. It is hoped that it will also be found useful by teachers, especially by those who have not access to a public library.

In order to keep the list within bounds it has been necessary to exclude almost all government and many state publications. Lists of available government publications may be obtained free from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C. The A. L. A. Book-list has a bi-monthly section devoted to the evaluation of current public documents. Certain societies publishing excellent material have been omitted because they supply their publications only to members. The subject of library economy has been omitted because it is well covered by the index to reference lists published annually in the January number of the Bulletin of Bibliography. Geography, including industries, is not included because a bulletin of sixty pages on this subject has been issued by the Eastern Illinois State Normal school at Charleston. The highest limit in price has been placed at fifty cents.

Where no price is stated the publications are free to libraries but a price may be charged individuals. Certain publications which were not seen, but which there was reason to believe would prove worthy, have been listed with a note showing that they have not been examined.

In writing for publications issued by societies and manufacturing firms, enclose postage. Address the proper department for the state publications, enclosing postage. Write to your congressman for the pamphlets published by the United States government. If he has copies at his disposal, he will send them free, but if not, the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., will supply them at the price stated in the list. Because of the ephemeral nature of many of these publications some titles given in this list may even now be out of print. In order to prevent possible loss of time should this prove to be the case, it is usually better, when writing for a certain title, to add a request for other similar publications.



To keep up with the material obtainable free or at small cost which is being constantly issued, consult the Monthly catalogue of United States public documents and the Monthly list of state publications, both distributed by the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C. Notices of recent pamphlets may be found in Library Journal, Public Libraries, Special Libraries, Wisconsin Library Bulletin, American City, National Municipal Review, Survey, engineering periodicals, trade journals, general magazines and newspapers.

The generosity of societies, firms and individuals in sending material for examination has made this list possible and their kindness is appreciated. Thanks are due to the American Library Association Publishing Board, 78 E. Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois, for permission to reprint this list as a bulletin of this school.
