CHARLESTON, IL.--KAREN MEYER of Charleston, Eastern Illinois University senior personnel management major, is one of six recipients of the prestigious Livingston C. Lord Memorial Scholarship.

Established by the alumni association in memory of Lord, president of EIU from 1899-1933, this is the University's highest award for scholarship.

The six students, who represent the University's six academic colleges, received their awards at commencement.

MEYER is from the Lumpkin College of Business. She will graduate in December with a B.S. in Business.

She previously received a Charleston Rotary Club Scholarship, is on the Dean's honor list and a member of Delta Mu Delta, the national honor society in business administration.
