CHARLESTON, IL--Approximately 1,600 students are eligible to participate in spring commencement at Eastern Illinois University on Saturday, May 15 in the Library-Union Quadrangle.

Ceremonies will be held at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Taking part in the morning service are students from the Graduate School, College of Arts and Sciences, and the Schools of Fine Arts and Home Economics. At 2 p.m., graduates will be from the Schools of Business, Education, Health, Physical Education and Recreation, Technology and the Board of Governors degree program.

Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degrees will be presented to J. Ray Livesay, Mattoon, at the morning ceremony and to Harold D. Hoopman, President of Marathon Oil Company, in the afternoon. Livesay is president and general manager of the J. R. Livesay Group, which operates seven radio stations in three states.

Dr. Stanley G. Rives, Vice-President for Academic Affairs, will present the candidates. President Daniel E. Marvin, Jr. will confer degrees and award diplomas.
