PYLES SELECTED TO ATTEND HARVARD SUMMER PROGRAM

CHARLESTON, IL.--Carol D. Pyles, Dean of the College of Health, Physical Education and Recreation at Eastern Illinois University, has been selected as one of 95 participants from around the world to attend Harvard University's summer 1990 Management Development Program (MDP).
