ANNUAL MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. CANDLELIGHT VIGIL SET TO TAKE PLACE AT EIU

CHARLESTON – Community residents are once again invited to join the students and staff of Eastern Illinois University as they commemorate the life and accomplishments of Martin Luther King Jr.

As is customary, the event will begin with a candlelight march across a portion of Eastern's campus. This year's walk, beginning at 6:30 p.m. Monday, Jan. 20, will originate from Thomas Hall, 2120 Seventh St., and end at the University Ballroom, located in the Martin Luther King Jr. University Union.
