## EIU PRESIDENT'S CLUB ADDS NEW MEMBERS

CHARLESTON, IL.-- Eastern Illinois University's Tenth Decade

Campaign initiated in 1984 to raise \$5 million in private support in

five years has produced more than \$6 million.

Private giving to the University through its Foundation has reached \$6,069,815, EIU President Stan Rives reported at the annual President's Club dinner held recently.

The President's Club membership is composed of 114 individuals who gave \$1,000 or more and five corporations who gave \$5,000 or more annually.

Rives said the Foundation has now begun the next phase of its development effort, the Second Century Campaign, with the appointment of Vice President for Development Stephen Falk, formerly of Central Michigan University.

Falk is currently planning a feasibility study for a larger major fundraising campaign. "I think we have found a marvelous match between Steve Falk and the needs of the institution," Rives said.

Rives emphasized that Eastern is a publicly-assisted, not a publicly-supported institution. He said a steady decline in state support of education has made the need for private support "more and more important to Eastern to maintain our education."

Mrs. Nancy Froelich of Lake Bloomington, Chairman of the Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities, brought greetings from the Board and congratulated the Foundation on successfully raising its \$5 million goal of the Tenth Decade Campaign in May 1988, 18 months ahead of schedule.
