EIU STUDENTS INDUCTED INTO BETA GAMMA SIGMA

CHARLESTON -- Eighteen students have recently been inducted into Beta Gamma Sigma at Eastern Illinois University.

Beta Gamma Sigma is the honor society for collegiate schools of business. It is an international organization with 270 collegiate chapters and over 300,000 alumni living around the world.

Chapters are established at schools and colleges of business in the United States and Canada which are accredited by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business.

Eastern's Chapter was recently recognized by the National Chapter of Beta Gamma Sigma as the Most Outstanding Chapter of the Year. The Chapter adviser is Mike Wilson, director of Eastern's MBA program.

Membership in Beta Gamma Sigma is the highest scholastic recognition a student can receive in an undergraduate or master's program in business or management. To be eligible for membership, a student must rank in the upper 10
