NEWTON BROTHERS ENJOY BAN-
QUET OF HOT CAKES AT RE-
UNION ON REMOTE ISLAND

Somewhere in Philippines (Delayed)

Over a lunch of hotcakes made by the older brother, Marine Private First Class Lloyd D. Wilson, 19, and Army Private First Class Floyd R. Wilson, 21, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel H. Wilson, 524 West Reynolds St. Newton, Ill., enjoyed their first visit together in two years.

They were reunited on this island in the Philippines when Lloyd, who is serving in the Marine aviation unit that is operating against the Japs in this area, heard that his brother's outfit was but a short distance down the road. He immediately caught a ride in that direction and arrived just as Floyd was preparing his evening meal.

"Floyd has grown a lot, but I knew him as soon as I saw him," said Lloyd.

They hadn't seen each other since Floyd became a paratrooper in January, 1943.
