RAMAGE RECEIVES 2006 WILLIAMS TRAVEL AWARD

CHARLESTON – Emily Ramage, a graduate candidate in English at Eastern Illinois University, recently received the 2006 Williams Travel Award.

This award, named for Larry Williams, former dean of Eastern's Graduate School, was established by the school to provide travel support for graduate candidates who have had work accepted for presentation at regional, state or national conferences.
