EIU FACULTY TO DISCUSS EFFECTS OF TECHNOLOGY ON EDUCATION, BIOLOGY

CHARLESTON – Eastern Illinois University’s “Technology and Us” symposium continues next week with discussions on the effects of technology on education and biology.

Beginning at 7 p.m. Monday, March 3, Charles Rohn, dean of Eastern’s College of Education and Professional Studies, will present “Impact of Technology on Current Educational Efforts.” He will show how education has influenced technology – and how technology has affected education – during the past 100 years.

Immediately following Rohn’s presentation, Kipp Kruse, chair of Eastern’s Department of Biological Sciences, will address the enormous effects that technology has had on biology in the past century in a presentation titled, “Biotechnology – Fact and Myth!”

The event will take place in the Arcola/Tuscola Room of the University Union. Admission to both talks is free and open to the public.

The talks are two in a series in commemoration of Eastern’s School of Technology’s Centennial Anniversary.
