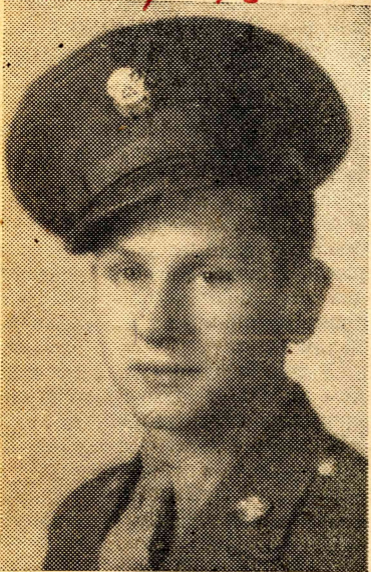

Willow Hill Boy Wounded In Germany

Mr. and Mrs. Vonnie Ragon of Willow Hill received a telegram from the War Department Tuesday stating that their son, Private Leon Ragon had been slightly wounded in Germany on March 4.

The message was not news to the parents for they had already received a letter from their son stating that he had been injured by being shot in the left leg, and that he was getting along O. K.

Pvt. Ragon is in the same regiment as Bob Worchester, Jim Laugel, Norman Benefiel, Glennard Strole and Max Aten, all of Jasper county. He is attached to Company C., 309th Infantry Division.
