CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois University will offer a Science Camp entitled, "Man's Physical Environment" for high school students on the Eastern campus . This camp is sponsored by the Geology/Geography Department, the College of Arts and Sciences and Adult and Continuing Education.

Education office. Enrollment is limited, so those interested in attending should apply early.

During the camp, students will investigate weather occurrences, the nature of the Earth's crust and the night skies. They will also be introduced to weather observation, map use and the analysis and interpretation of data.

Time will also be set aside each day for relaxation and recreational activities.

Students will also participate in a Geologic Field Trip to observe ice-age glacial deposits and ancient deltaic features in East Central Illinois.

The Registration fee for this week-long camp is \$215, which includes all instruction, materials, housing and meals in a University residence hall and recreational activities.

A \$30 deposit should accompany applications, with the balance of \$185 due by June 3.
