**ALLARD I. BEALS**  
**DIES MONDAY MORNING**

9/29/42

Allard I. Beals, a prominent farmer residing northwest of Newton passed away Monday morning at the Olney sanitarium, where he was taken fifteen days earlier. Death was due to high blood pressure and complications.

Mr. Beals was born near Newton, July 16, 1869, and had always resided here.

He leaves three children, Mrs. John R. Watkins and Victor Beals of Newton vicinity, and Mrs. Loren Clark of Decatur; grand-children; and many other relatives and friends. His wife preceded him in death six years ago.
