BAUER NAMED 1996 LIVINGSTON C. LORD SCHOLAR

CHARLESTON -- Michelle Bauer, daughter of Charles and Christine Bauer of Breese, is one of five recipients of Eastern Illinois University's 1996 Livingston C. Lord Scholarships, Eastern's most prestigious academic scholarships.

The scholarships, presented at Eastern's recent spring commencement, were established by the EIU Alumni Association in memory of Livingston C. Lord, Eastern's first president, who served from 1899 to 1933. Lord Scholars receive a substantial stipend and a medallion.

While going to college, Bauer has worked in Eastern's purchasing department.
