CRAWFORD PRESENTS PAPER AT PHI ALPHA THETA CONFERENCE

CHARLESTON -- Eastern Illinois University graduate student Kristan Crawford of Burr Ridge presented a paper at the annual Phi Alpha Theta Regional Conference held recently at Illinois State University.

Students from nine colleges presented papers at the conference.

Crawford's paper titled, "Constructing Community: The Meaning of Fairs, Court Days and Royal Celebrations in 18th-Century Virginia," won the award for best use of primary sources.

Crawford is enrolled in Eastern's master of arts in history degree program.

Newton Key, associate professor of history at Eastern and co-advisor of the university's chapter of Phi Alpha Theta history honor society, accompanied the students to the conference.
