CHARLESTON, IL--The unveiling of Newton Tarble's portrait will be a feature of the Tarble Arts Center dedication on Sunday, Sept. 26. The late Mr. Tarble, co-founder of the Snap-On Tool Company, was the principal donor of the Center, located on the campus of Eastern Illinois University.

The public ceremony will be held at the entrance plaza on the building's south side. Alternate location for the program in case of inclement weather, will be inside at the east end of the orientation-exhibition spine.

Included in the ceremony will be music by a brass ensemble beginning at 1:30 p.m., remarks by Eastern President Daniel E. Marvin, Jr., introduction of special guests, and a ribbon-cutting signaling the official opening of the Center.

Mrs. Newton Tarble will unveil the portrait. She will be assisted by her daughter, Miss Jan Tarble; Dr. Vaughn Jaenike, Dean of Eastern's School of Fine Arts; and Gilbert Early, the portrait artist.

Tarble, who was enrolled in Eastern's "Model School" and the four-year program from 1903 to 1909, gave \$1,000,000 toward construction of the \$1.4 million Center. The remainder of the funds came entirely from gifts from individuals, families, and business firms.
