## NOTED "GHOST" EXPERT TO LECTURE AT EIU

CHARLESTON -- Paranormal expert Peter Jordan inhabits a dark world -- a landscape filled with terrifying visions, phantom voices and demons.

He plans to bring that world to the campus of Eastern Illinois University via a presentation, titled "Ghosts," scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 28, in the University Union's Grand Ballroom. The cost is \$2 for general admission, free for EIU students with ID.

For more than 20 years, Jordan, a veteran field investigator for the famed Psychical Research Foundation located near Duke University, has doggedly pursued a trail of ghostly phenomena stretching from New Jersey to the Pacific Northwest. Using a gallery of shocking photographs and videotapes culled from hundreds of personal files, he brings into focus discoveries made in the scientific search for evidence of life after death, revealing dynamic links between haunting experiences, ancient earth energies and human psychic ability.

Many of Jordan's cases -- the "Amityville Horror" among his most famous -- were supplied, he says, by perplexed and often frightened individuals who contacted him after exhausting all rational explanations.
