CHARLESTON, IL--A Charleston native, a retired faculty member, and an artist whose speciality is classic cars will be honored with a reception at the Tarble Arts Center, Eastern Illinois University, on Sunday, June 12 from 2 to 5 p.m.

Dave Dooley, formerly of Charleston, and Nancy Graham are former students of Dr. Carl Shull, a longtime member of Eastern's Art Department until his retirement in 1982.

Works by the three artists will be exhibited at the Center through July 1. Dooley teaches art in the Lawrenceville schools and at Vincennes University. Ms. Graham has a studio in Santa Fe, N.M.

Shull has a series of paintings on paper that depict hooded figures, described by Shull as "a fascinating and intriguing theme to develop. By obscuring and hiding facial features and the head, the mind is left open to explore many avenues of thought and interpretation."

Dooley's drawings "represent a transitional period from abstract to representational." Dooley holds B.S. and M.S. degrees from Eastern, and advanced study at the University of Illinois and the Chicago Art Academy.

Don Carmichael, Director of the Center, said "Ms. Graham has developed a unique method of capturing classic automobiles in both water-colors and acrylics." Ms. Graham also holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from Eastern.
