HONORS CAMP SET

CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois University's Honors Programs, School of Adult and Continuing Education, and the Departments of Economics and English will host an honors camp July 12-22, for high school juniors who rank in the upper 25% of their class and have the recommendation of their high school principal.

Students wishing to attend the camp are asked to send a \$50 deposit along with their application to The School of Adult and Continuing Education, Eastern Illinois University, Booth House, Charleston, Illinois, 61920, by June 1. The total cost of the camp is \$299, which includes materials, housing, meals, accident insurance, as well as recreational and cultural activities.

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HONORS CAMP SET

The camp will consist of two classes. "The Principles of Macroeconomics," taught by Dr. Ebrahim Karbassioon of Eastern's Economics Department, intends to build a conceptual foundation of basic and modern economic theory as well as to connect this theory with modern policies and issues. Heather Rubach, a junior University and Departmental Honors student, will assist Dr. Karbassioon in class and stay with the students in the residence hall.

"Creative Writing: Poetry and Fiction," taught by Dr. Bruce Guernsey of Eastern's English Department, will provide an introduction to the writing of poetry and short fiction with emphasis on the technical aspects of both. Joe Mullin, a junior English major and University Honors student, will assist Dr. Guernsey in class and stay with the students in the residence hall.

In addition to class and computer time, students will have time for recreational and cultural activities. Two semester hours of credit will be given to students who successfully complete the course.
