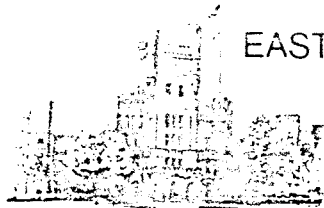

CHARLESTON, IL--The Tarble Arts Center at Eastern Illinois University will be formally dedicated on Sunday, Sept. 26 in ceremonies beginning at 1:30 p.m. with a half-hour concert.

The program will include the unveiling of a portrait of the late Newton E. Tarble, principle donor of the facility. Tarble, an Eastern alumnus, gave \$1,000,000 toward the \$1.4 million project. The remainder of the construction costs came from public donations.

Works by artists Al Allen and Dean Fausett, and Life Magazine's collection of World War II art will be on display.

Eastern's president, Dr. Daniel E. Marvin, Jr., will take part in a ribbon-cutting ceremony. Sen. Max Coffey and Rep. Harry (Babe) Woodyard, both of the 53rd District, will accept the facility for the people of the State of Illinois.

Among special guests will be Clifford Grunloh, Effingham, general contractor on the project, and arts figures from across the United States.
