CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois University will host its annual high school visitation program, "A Closer Look," on Monday, Oct. 11.

According to John Beacon, Director of Admissions, the program is intended primarily for high school juniors and seniors who are in the process of selecting a college to attend after high school graduation. Parents are invited and encouraged to participate with their sons and daughters.

"The program will begin at 9 a.m. in Dvorak Hall of the Doudna Fine Arts Center with a general information session. Topics to be discussed include admissions criteria and procedure, housing on campus and various forms of financial assistance available in 1983," said Beacon.

The remainder of the program will include informal meetings with faculty representatives, tours of campus and residence halls, and lunch in a residence food service for \$1.25.

"We think we have designed a program that allows each student a great deal of freedom to explore their particular areas of interest," Beacon commented. "We hope to see as many interested students as possible on the 11th."

Parking is adequate in the visitors' lot east of the main administration building.
