Oct. 12, 1945

Darrel Miller of West Liberty, was recently promoted to technician fifth grade, it was announced by an Army headquarters in Hawaii. He is a supply clerk in the 3117th Ordnance Base Armored Vehicle Maintenance company and has been in the Central Pacific area since January, 1945. A son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles O. Joseph of near West Liberty, Corporal Miller was employed by the Pure Oil Company before entering the Army in October, 1942.

The 617th Ordnance battalion, of which Miller's company is a part, was recently awarded the Meritorious Service Unit plaque by Major General H. T. Burgin, commanding general of the Central Pacific command, for "exceptionally meritorious service" during the first six months of 1945.

Among local boys Miller has met in the Hawaiian islands are Richard Hunsinger, James McKensie, William Taffee, and Charles Warner.
