CHARLESTON, IL--Dr. Morris T. Keeton, a Distinguished Visiting Professor at Eastern Illinois University's Summer School, will lecture on "State and Federal Public Policies for Adult Learners," on Friday, Aug. 3, at 7 p.m. in Phipps Lecture Hall of the Science Building. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Keeton, President of the Council for the Advancement of Experiential Learning, will teach a workshop on the future for adult education in America, Aug. 3-4.

Currently Chair of the American Council on Education's Commission on Higher Education and the Adult Learner, Keeton received his PhD in Philosophy from Harvard University in 1938. He was a member of the faculty of Antioch College from 1947 until 1977, eventually assuming the position Provost and Vice President and, from 1975-76, acting President.

Keeton has participated in the development of public policy, both federal and state, for the improvement of university programs for adult learners. He has called adult learners "America's greatest neglected resource." His experience in adult education makes him uniquely qualified to teach a workshop on the future of adult education in America.
