FORSEE RECIPIENT OF CURSOR SUMMER RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

CHARLESTON -- Jennifer Forsee, daughter of Gary and Diane Forsee of Coffeen, is the recipient of a Council on Undergraduate Research Summer Opportunities for Research (CURSOR) Fellowship.

The award, administered by the Council on Undergraduate Research, is sponsored by an anonymous private foundation and provides a \$2,800 student stipend plus an additional \$500 for living expenses.

Forsee is among 25 CURSOR Fellows nationwide who will be engaged in full-time research projects at their home institutions this summer. More than 200 students applied for fellowships.

A 1992 graduate of Hillsboro High School, Forsee is a senior chemistry and pre-med major. Her faculty research sponsor is T. Howard Black, professor of Chemistry. The title of her research project is "Synthesis of Analgesic Antagonists."

Eastern, which is celebrating its 100th anniversary in 1994-95, is a comprehensive university with more than 10,500 students and 46 undergraduate and 27 graduate degree programs. It is a teaching institution which prides itself on the quality and affordability of its undergraduate program.
