CHARLESTON, IL--Dr. Judith A. Anderson has been named Director of Affirmative Action at Eastern Illinois University. The appointment is half-time and becomes effective immediately.

Before accepting the position, Dr. Anderson was a therapist in the Cumberland County Mental Health and Family Counseling Center in Toledo, Ill.

Dr. Anderson earned the Ph.D. in Guidance and Psychological Services at Indiana State University. She also holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Indiana State.

She is a former administrator of a statewide demonstration project in Florida which addressed barriers to employment for minority populations.

As director of a career development project, United Cerebral Palsey of Florida, Dr. Anderson developed and implemented a statewide network of career centers providing services and training to disabled adults.

Dr. Anderson in 1977-78 was an Assistant Professor of Human Services and Studies, Florida State University. Prior to that she was a teaching fellow in guidance and counseling at Indiana State and was a counselor-consultant in the Vigo County (Indiana) elementary schools.

She has written widely in the area of career development of the handicapped and has participated in a number of workshops in the field.
