MIAMI BEACH--John David Reed, adviser to student publications at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, IL, has been honored by the National Council of College Publications Advisers (NCCPA) for his work with student publications.

Reed was presented the organization's Distinguished Newspaper Adviser Award for four-year college newspapers at the annual awards banquet during NCCPA's convention in Miami Beach.

The NCCPA--the only professional association for advisers to university and college student publications--annually honors individuals who excel in their work with students and their publications.

Reed is the 24th recipient of the award, established in 1960 to recognize excellence in student publications advising and outstanding contribution to the collegiate press by NCCPA members.

Reed has been adviser to the Daily Eastern News, which became a daily newspaper in 1973, since he joined Eastern's journalism faculty in 1972 after five years as a reporter for the Chicago Sun-Times.

He is a doctoral candidate in journalism at Southern Illinois University and holds a master's degree in journalism from the University of Missouri and a bachelor's degree in English from the University of Illinois.

A native of Mattoon, Reed is the son of Mrs. Helen J. Reed of 1121 S. 16th St., Mattoon.
