CHARLESTON, IL--The annual meeting of the Eastern Illinois University Foundation will be held on Sunday, Aug. 26, in the University Union.

Dr. Stanley Rives, Eastern's president, will address the luncheon meeting. The annual financial report will be presented by Dave Riddle, assistant treasurer.

The Foundation, with assets in excess of \$2,000,000, receives and administers gifts for scholarships and awards "with the primary object of serving purposes other than those for which the State of Illinois makes sufficient appropriations."

During the past year the Foundation paid out \$53,656 in scholarships and \$157,446 for grants to the University other than scholarships.

Cecil Swedell of Charleston is the Foundation's president and Marjorie Hutton, also of Charleston, is the vice president. New officers will be elected at the Board of Directors' meeting following the general session.
