CHARLESTON, IL--Paul Manz and David Weck will be clinicians for the annual Church Music Workshops at Eastern Illinois University on Saturday, Sept. 8. They are internationally-recognized in their fields and are being sponsored by the Lincoln Heritage Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, the EIU Office of Faculty Development, and the Hymn Society of America.

The workshops, beginning at 9 a.m. in Dvorak Concert Hall in the Doudna Fine Arts Center, are open to the public at no charge.

Manz, of the Lutheran School of Theology and cantor at the Evangelical Lutheran Church of St. Luke in Chicago, will present two workshops titled "The Glory of the Hymn." Known for his organ improvisations as well as for his choral and organ publications, Manz has served on the national council of the American Guild of Organists. He is appearing as an "ambassador" for The Hymn Society of America.

Weck is an editor at Hope Publishing Company, specializing in music for youth. He has composed a number of choral anthems and has compiled and edited a series of handbell pieces. He will conduct choral reading sessions and present a workshop on youth involvement through music. Weck is also director of the Jay Stream Singers, an active recording and touring group. He will be available for consultation with children's choir directors at the lunch hour.
