MINUTES OF COUNCIL ON ACADEMIC AFFAIRS  
January 14, 1960

The Council on Academic Affairs held its fifth meeting at 10 a.m., January 14, 1960 in the Blair Hall Lounge - B207.

Members present were: Mr. Damann, Mr. Giffin, Mr. Heath, Mr. Landis, Mr. Lefler, Miss Reinhardt, Mr. Rommel, Miss Smith and Mr. Tingley. Ex-officio members: Mr. Manbeck and Mr. Heller.

I. Operating Procedures

Mr. Tingley moved that the operating procedures for the Council on Academic Affairs be accepted. Mr. Giffin seconded the motion. It was approved unanimously. (A copy of the procedures is included as an attachment to these minutes.)

II. Medical Technology

(a) Mr. Tingley moved and Miss Smith seconded the motion that a B.S. degree with a major in Medical Technology be approved. The motion passed.

(b) Mr. Rommel moved that the curriculum for Medical Technology be referred back to the committee with the request that they consider the role of physics in the program. Mr. Heath seconded the motion. The motion passed.
