CHARLESTON, IL--Dr. Charles Joley today was named Dean of the School of Education at Eastern Illinois University, effective Nov. 1.

The Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities approved President Daniel E. Marvin's recommendation for the appointment at its meeting in Macomb. Joley, who has been Director of Occupational Education at Eastern since 1970, succeeds Dr. Frank Lutz.

Joley is the University's liaison officer with the Illinois Office of Education's Department of Adult, Vocational and Technical Education. He was recently elected to a third term as Chairman of the University Council for Vocational Education in Illinois.

Marvin said "Dr. Joley's training in educational administration and the experience he has gained in his present position make him well suited for the position of Dean. I am sure he will capably discharge the responsibilities of the office."

Joley holds the M.S. degree and the doctorate in educational administration from the University of Illinois. From 1970 to 1978 he was Coordinator of Field Services, Center for Educational Studies in the School of Education.

Prior to 1970 Joley was Director of Administrative Services, Eastern Illinois Development and Service Unit in the Charleston Community Unit District.

His public school experience includes the superintendency of schools at Oakland and Cullom. He was one of the nine original executive board members who established and promoted the formation of Lake Land College.

Joley has written widely in the field of career occupations and has presented a number of papers on the subject. He was one of four persons selected nationally to represent U.S. educators in Poland at the invitation of the Minister of Education and Enlightenment. He also helped establish an exchange program between Eastern and a university in Poland.

This past summer Joley was accepted by Harvard University's Graduate School of Education to take part in a program on "The Emerging Roles of Educators in Business."
