CHARLESTON, IL.-A regional faculty development seminar on occupational safety and health is being conducted at Eastern Illinois University by the Management/Marketing Department, Thursday and Friday (April 17-18).

Sponsored by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, the seminar will include faculty from 15 midwest and southwest universities, according to Dr. Foster Rinefort, coordinator of the College of Business MBA program and seminar co-director.

"This conference is part of Project Minerva which is a business school safety and health education program supported by the federal government, private industry, academic institutions, trade associations and organized labor," said Rinefort.

"This seminar will describe how information and materials on occupational safety and health can be integrated into academic undergraduate and graduate work in management."

Besides Rinefort, other speakers include co-director Dr. Jerry Geisler of EIU's College of Business, Dr. James Walters of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, Michael Taubitz of General Motors and Drs. Ed Brankey, Ed Marlow and Stuart Rosenkrantz, all of EIU's College of Business.

Educational institutions sending participants include Amarillo, Ball State, Central Michigan, Keller, Louisiana Tech, Murray State, Mankato State, Northern Illinois, Northeast Missouri, Northeast Louisiana, North Texas, Western Illinois, Wis-LaCrosse and Wis-Oshkosh.
