MORE THAN 3,500 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN SUMMER SCHOOL AT EIU

CHARLESTON, IL--Preliminary figures indicate that Eastern Illinois University's regular Summer School enrollment is "right on target," according to EIU Vice President for Student Affairs Glenn Williams.

Enrollment in the Summer Intersession was up 123 from 1,350 last year to 1,473 this Summer.

The regular Summer School enrollment is 3,577 compared with last summer's early count of 3,616. Williams estimated, however, that this summer's final count should be over 3,700 due in part to a number of Chicago Percy Julian High School students who are enrolled in Eastern's five-week summer session.

He added that during the past nine years, the average increase in enrollment between June and August has been 95. The largest increase in enrollment during that three-month period was 124 in 1983.

A breakdown of the 3,577 early figure shows 2,489 undergraduates, 1,088 graduates; 1,410 men, 2,167 women; 2,298 part-time, 1,279 full-time; and 139 new freshmen compared with 151 in 1987.

Eastern for the first time was forced to close Summer School admission to undergraduates on April 25.
