EIU COURSES OFFERED IN CHAMPAIGN-URBANA

CHARLESTON -- Eastern Illinois University will offer a variety of evening and weekend fall semester courses in Champaign-Urbana beginning Aug. 25.

Two weekend graduate/undergraduate courses will be held at Parkland College, 2400 West Bradley, Champaign. They include *Manufacturing Strategies* from 6 to 10 p.m. Friday and from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday on Oct. 10-11 and Oct. 17-18; and *Introduction to Reliability* from 6 to 10 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 31, and from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 1.
