ITASCA, IL--The Applied Arts-Education Center at Eastern Illinois University today was renamed the Applied Sciences Building. The change was recommended by President Stanley Rives and approved by the Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities at its September meeting.

The building houses the Schools of Home Economics and Technology, recently organized as the College of Applied Sciences. Rives said "the new name more appropriately fits the facility."

The Board also approved the name of Ninth Street Hall for the recently-purchased Kappa Delta Sorority house on Ninth Street. The structure opened this fall as a residence hall and houses 54 men students.

In other action the Board:

Approved recommendations for purchase of equipment and supplies, including a 200-foot self-supporting tower to support an FM radio and television antenna for use by the Radio and Television Center, and a used offset newspaper press to add a third unit to the capabilities of the Daily Eastern News, student newspaper; approved an administrative leave for Dr. Vaughn Jaenike, Dean of the College of Fine Arts.
