CHARLESTON, IL.--Dr. Glenn Williams of Charleston, Vice President for Student Affairs at Eastern Illinois University, will receive the Livingston C. Lord Distinguished Service Award, the University's most prestigious honor, during Eastern's Founder's Day activities Saturday, June 24.

During the awards ceremony, three University service awards will also be presented to employees for their exemplary service to the University.
