CHARLESTON, IL.--'Global Interdependence: Traditions and Transitions', the theme of Eastern Illinois University's 1986 Summer School, will "address the ideas, concepts, issues and conflicts relating to international interdependence," said Dr. Charles Switzer, Summer School director.

Workshops related to the theme include:

- \* Joan Embery, Goodwill Ambassador for the San Diego Zoo, on wildlife survival.
- \* Fred Luthans and Sang Lee, University of Nebraska, on the changing role of modern management in the workplace.
- \* Judy-Arin Krupp, an expert on adult development, on major life transitions.
- \* Richard Farmer, Indiana University, on international business.
- \* Dominic Murray, National University of Ireland, on education and social conflict.
- \* Dennis Pirages, University of Maryland, on global ecopolitics.

Special activities include a Saturday, June 21 Founder's Day celebration with programs, exhibits and alumni activities focusing on the 'Traditions and Transitions' theme.

"Fifteen one semester hour one week or weekend workshops will be offered on various perspectives on the summer theme," Switzer said.

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They include Plants, Agriculture and Human Society; the Impact of Climatic Change on an Interdependent World; Food/Nutrition: Survival in an Interdependent World; Communication and Worldwide Health; Entrepreneurship: The Key to World Economic Progress; Meeting the International Competitive Challenge: Lessons for the United States; Art and Society in Periods of Transition; and From Anonymity to Leadership: Emergence of New Roles for Women in Today's World.

In addition, several special courses and many workshops offer continuing students, adult learners, professionals and teachers an "opportunity to update their knowledge and skills," said Switzer.
