CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois University's Greek community will open its 41st annual Greek Week with "Greek Sing," the largest amateur choir competition in the Midwest, according to Tim McGuire, Greek Week publicity chair.

"Greek Week enables members of the Greek community to show their pride, spirit and unity to the campus and community, while having fun in competitive events and raising money for their selected philanthropies," according to McGuire.

Last year, Eastern's Greek community donated more than 4,000 hours and \$21,000 to charitable organizations.

The public is invited to the Greek Sing at 1 p.m. Sunday, April 12, in McAfee Gymnasium. Eastern's fraternities and sororities will give informal or formal presentations, which will be judged by five professionals, representing different areas of the state. Admission is \$2.50 for Eastern students with identification and \$3 for non-students.

Another event open to the public is the coronation of the Greek "God" and "Goddess" at 7 p.m. Monday in the University Union's Grand Ballroom. Admission is \$1. Eight sorority women and 11 fraternity men are competing for the respective crowns and will be selected by a vote of their peers. The winners will preside at special ceremonies and events throughout the week.

Greek Week will continue through Saturday with a variety of competitive games and fundraising activities.
