EIU TO CROWN 1998 MISS BLACK EIU

CHARLESTON -- A month-long celebration commemorating African-American heritage will close with a special tribute to African-American women.

"Sankofa," the 22nd annual Miss Black EIU Pageant, sponsored by Eastern's Black Student Union, will begin at 7 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 28, at the Martin Luther King Jr. University Union Grand Ballroom.

Since its inception in 1971, the pageant has become one of Eastern's largest cultural events. It pays special tribute to African-American women while instilling a sense of pride, appreciation and cultural awareness in their heritage.

Through the years, more than 100 young women have competed for the coveted crown of Miss Black EIU.
