EIU OFFERS COURSES IN DANVILLE

CHARLESTON -- Eastern Illinois University is offering several courses at Danville Area Community College to support learners enrolled in EIU's Board of Trustees Bachelor of Arts degree program.

This program, formerly known as the Board of Governors Bachelor of Arts (BOG/BA) degree program, allows individuals to complete an undergraduate degree by building on two years of community college credit with upper-division courses and credit for work-related experience.

One graduate course -- "Language Arts in the Elementary School" (ELE 5650-116) -- will be offered from 7-9:30 p.m. on Thursdays beginning Jan. 22.

There are five graduate/undergraduate courses being offered: "Sociotechnical Design" (COS 4820-116); "Occupational Perspectives: Past, Present and Future" (COS 4830-116); "New Paradigms in Leadership and Management" (COS 4850-115); "Productive Work Teams" (COS 4850-116); and "Where Have All the Dolphins Gone?" (ZOO 4985-116).

Also offered are nine undergraduate courses offered in African-American studies, College of Sciences, elementary education, educational foundations, Eastern Illinois University (senior seminars), geology, journalism and sociology.
