CHARLESTON, IL--The 24th Eastern Illinois University Bluegrass Jam Session will be held at the University Union on Sunday, March 14 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Concerts will start at 1 p.m.

A spokesman said traditional bluegrass will be played and electric instruments are not allowed. The event is sponsored by the University Union.

CHARLESTON, IL--The former governing mayor of West Berlin, Dietrich Stobbe, will speak at Eastern Illinois University on Tuesday, March 16 at 7:30 p.m. in the Charleston-Mattoon Room of the University Union.

Stobbe will speak on "European-American Relations and the Future of the Atlantic Alliance." A question and answer period will follow the lecture.

After serving as mayor from 1977 to 1981, Stobbe became head of the Friedrich-Ebert Foundation in New York. The Foundation is affiliated with the Social Democratic party of West Germany and has a liaison office with the United Nations.

Stobbe was elected to the West Berlin House of Representatives in 1967 and in 1973 he was appointed Senator (Minister) for Federal Affairs. He received his university diploma in political science at the Free University of West Berlin.

His appearance at Eastern will be sponsored by the departments of history and political science.
