CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois University's basketball Panthers take a short break from conference action to host Eastern Washington Saturday (Jan. 28) night before closing the January schedule at AMCU-8 preseason favorite Illinois-Chicago Monday (Jan. 30). Game time for both is 7:30 CST.

Eastern is 7-7 overall and 3-2 in the Mid-Continent (prior to Wednesday's game at Western Illinois). The Panthers had a three game win streak snapped by Northern Iowa, 65-60, Monday night.

Eastern Washington, in its first year in Division I, is having growing pains as the Eagles are struggling with a 3-17 record. They have lost ten of their last 11 and last week snapped a nine game losing streak with a 77-70 win over Idaho.

Illinois-Chicago, 11-6 overall under first year coach Willie Little, is 3-2 in the conference following Monday's 95-65 win over Valparaiso and is tied with EIU and Wis-Green Bay for second place in the league at 3-2.

"Eastern Washington is struggling right now . . . they've won only one game on the road so are primed to upset someone. Since it's not a conference game we must guard against a letdown," said coach Rick Samuels.

"Illinois-Chicago has great overall talent and is in the top ten in the nation in scoring . . . something like 83-84 points a game. We have played pretty good defense lately but will need a great defensive effort there."

THE COACHES: Eastern Washington's Jerry Krause, in his 16th season, has returned after a one year sabbatical to oversee the progression to Division I . . . he has an overall record of 249-176 with 12 winning seasons in the last 13 years.

EIU's Rick Samuels, in his fourth season, is 50-49 overall . . . in his first three seasons the Panthers were 16-11, 14-13, and 13-18 . . . he previously was an assistant at Iowa State and Eastern Washington.

EIU-UIC in '83: Dirk Androff (Decatur-Eisenhower) played his best game of the season scoring 16 points with 14 rebounds to lead the Panthers to an 86-74 win before 4500 fans, the largest home crowd of the year for EIU.

> Doug Crook's career high 29 points wasn't enough at UIC as the Flame defeated the Panthers, 90-77, in overtime.

- **KRAUSE-SAMUEL CONNECTION:** EIU's Rick Samuels was an assistant for Jerry Krause at Eastern Washington in 1975-76 . . . that season the Eagles were 21-7 and reached the NAIA district playoffs.
- SCORING SLUMP: The Panthers topped 70 points in six of their first seven averaging almost 75 points during this stretch . . . the last seven games they have been under 70 averaging only 62 a game.

- ABOUT EWU: Eastern Washington, located in Cheney just south of Spokane, has advanced from a perennial NAIA tournament participant to Division I this year . . . currently 3-17, the Eagles only victories are an 82-78 opener over Warner Pacific, 68-66 over Santa Barbara and then ten days ago, 77-70, over Idaho . . . 6-9 junior Tony Chrisman is the leading scorer with a 17.1 average . . . he has hit over 20 points in five of the last seven games . . . 6-2 guard Jeff Reinland is averaging 12.8 and 6-1 junior guard Melvin Bradley out of Chicago Westinghouse is scoring right at ten per game . . . the Eagles will play at Western Illinois Monday (1/30) to conclude a brief midwestern trip.
- ABOUT UIC: Solidly picked to win the AMCU-8, the Flame are 11-6 overall prior to 1/28 showdown with a league leader Northern Iowa in the UIC Pavilion . . . the Flame are 3-2 in the league losing road games by a total of three points at Northern Iowa and Southwest Missouri . . . averaging 83 points a game, UIC is ranked No. 7 in the nation . . guard Craig Lathen is No. 2 in the country in assists with 9.5 per game . . . guard John Ellis, brother of EIU running back Roy Ellis, leads with a 16.4 scoring average . . . forward Tim Anderson, sidelined recently with an ankle injury, is next at 14.6.
- SAMUELS SAYS: "We're still having the same problem of getting behind too much too early and then have to play catchup . . . we can't expect to dig out of a hole each time. We have to play well for more than just a half to expect to win in this league and, on occasion this year, have played a solid 40 minutes . . . but not consistently. Right now, also, our offense is simply not in sync . . . (Kevin) Duckworth is our best shooter but we haven't gotten the ball to him enough inside. Vincent (Smelter) is the only one who has played consistently well since the Christmas break . . . and he's played well on both ends of the court."
