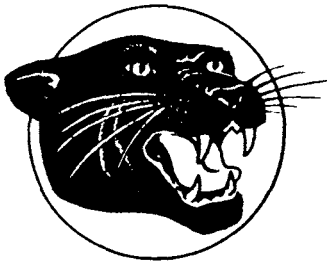

Eastern Illinois University hosts New York Tech (10-10), 7:30 p.m., Monday, Feb. 23, Lantz Gym, Charleston, IL.

THE COACHES: Eastern's Rick Samuels is in his first season after a four year stint as an assistant at Iowa State.

WIU's Jack Margenthaler, in his fourth year, has a 65-42 record. Last year's team was 19-10, finishing second in the North Central Regional.

NY Tech's Ron Ganulin is in his first year. He was an assistant last year when the Bears finished 2nd in the NCAA II.

THE SERIES: EIU trails Western, 57-43. This is the first meeting between the Panthers and NY Tech.

THIS YEAR: The Panthers lost at the buzzer on a 20 footer by Jamie Lilly, 72-71, in double overtime. EIU's Ricky Robinson had put in a bucket with eight seconds left to give EIU a brief lead before Lilly fired from the sidelines as time expired.

MCC RACE: The Mid-Continent Conference race has simplified considerably. Eastern must win against WIU to force a four-way tie for the championship. Otherwise, the Leather-necks are conference champs and EIU falls to last place. Youngstown State and Northern Michigan have finished at 3-3. Western is 3-2 and EIU 2-3 entering the final MCC game.

EIU FACTS: EIU has won five of its last six . . . has taken eight of 11 . . . has guaranteed an eighth straight winning season . . . has limited opponents to a 58 point average the last six games . . . has defeated two nationally ranked teams, Wright State (No. 2) and Central Missouri (No. 3) and knocked off two more potential tournament teams, Northern Michigan and Kentucky Wesleyan . . . has eased back up towards the 50% shooting mark as a team (49.9%). . . Ricky Robinson's 428 points this season tops his previous two years combined (417) . . . Jim Williams is hitting 69% from the field during this win streak.

EIU BASKETBALL

WIU FACTS: The Leathernecks are headed for their second straight NCAA II tournament berth . . . they've won 14 in a row at home . . . a crowd in excess of 7000 is expected for Saturday's game . . . they only need 4983 to set a new season attendance record . . . guard Dwayne Banks is tied with graduated Brad Bainter for fourth place on all-time scoring list at 1508 . . . Joe Dykstra was chosen the conference 'player of the week' by scoring 73 points in three games, had 20 rebounds, hit 51% from the field and 21 of 25 from the line . . . Dykstra leads the MCC with a 20.4 scoring average . . . the 6-6 sophomore is also tops in rebounds at 6.8 per game . . . he has scored in double figures in 28 straight games . . . WIU averages 81.9 as a team shooting 49.4% from the field . . . if the Leathernecks win their final two, it will be their first 20 win season since 1961-62.

NY TECH FACTS: The Bears were 23-5 last year, finishing second to Virginia Union in the NCAA II National Championship . . . however they lost three starters off that club . . . the top returnee is 6-4 guard Bobby Jones, previously at West Texas State . . . Jones is scoring 19 points a game . . . shooting 58% from the field . . . was named to NCAA II all-tournament team last year . . . other returning starter is guard Peter Edwards, who's hitting 15 per game . . . described as "best ball handling guard in New York metropolitan area" . . . the third double figure scorer is freshman 'Pike' DeBerry (15.7) . . . one of the best shooting teams to come to Lantz with 51% average . . . however, opponents are hitting 53.1% from the field . . . EIU game is part of two-game midwest swing . . . the Bears head to Wright State for a Wednesday night (Feb. 25) encounter.

SAMUELS SAYS: "The Western game should be a great collegiate basketball contest . . . we'd like that win to avoid finishing in the league cellar but, regardless, we feel positive about our play during the second half of the season . . . in a short time I've learned this is a good rivalry with Western, and I'm happy that both teams are going into the game on an upbeat . . . Jack (Margenthaler) has done an excellent job at Western . . . they are an excellent shooting team . . . they score quite a bit and we have been pretty stingy lately so it will be quite interesting to see what happens . . . I do know that game-in, game-out (Joe) Dykstra is one of, if not, the league's best player . . . individually it's difficult for us to match up with their talent so it will take a complete team effort on our part.

"Our confidence grows a bit with each win . . . Jim Williams has given us good play on both ends of the floor . . . I'd guess he leads us in offensive rebounds . . . with Robinson playing the perimeter more, Williams has been the big man inside . . . I feel right now that we have three or four players capable of hitting in double figures on a consistent basis . . . at least we've reached a point where the defense can't single out just one or two players."
