

REVIEWING THE WEEKEND (May 5-6)

MEN'S TRACK: The Panthers finished second in the Mid-Continent championship meet. It was the fourth time in five years EIU has taken second place. Northern Iowa won with 197, EIU had 168, Western Illinois had 112, Southwest Missouri was fourth with 103, Cleveland State 50 and Illinois-Chicago 10.

CLAUDE MAGEE (Clermont, FL), junior sprinter, was the Panthers leading scorer in the meet with 23 points. He won the 200 in a conference record time of 21.16, took first in the 100 in 10.79, and ran anchor legs of the 400 and 1600 relays which were second (41.86) and fourth (3:17.3), respectively.

TOM LINDSAY (Palos Park-Sandburg), sophomore pole vaulter, was the team's third leading scorer with 14 points. He placed second in the decathlon with 6297 points and third in the pole vault with a personal best of 15-6 $\frac{1}{4}$. Of the ten decathlon events he won the long jump in 20-6 $\frac{1}{2}$ and placed second in three others.

LARRY THOENNISSON (Morton), sophomore weightman, was EIU's fourth leading scorer with 12 points. He was third in both the hammer and shot put with distances of 165-0 and 53-3 $\frac{3}{4}$, respectively.

A. J. LUCKETT (Effingham-St. Anthony), senior weightman, won the javelin with a meet record of 191-10. That bested the previous conference record of 188-2 set last year by Rod Deas of Southwest Missouri. That was the fourth time Lockett has topped 190 this year but short of his personal best of 196-4.

ROXY WOOD (Pekin), sophomore pole vaulter, set a conference and EIU record by winning the pole vault in 16-0 $\frac{1}{4}$. That topped the previous record of 16-0 set by Russ Adams of Northern Iowa last year. The old EIU record was also 16-0 set by Wood and two others.

DAN MATAS (Oak Park-River Forest), sophomore weightman, was second in the shot put with a throw of 55-8 $\frac{1}{4}$.

SCOTT ADAMSON (Moweaqua), freshman sprinter/hurdler, took third in the 400 intermediate hurdles with a 54.5 and ran a leg of the 400 relay which was second in 41.86.
