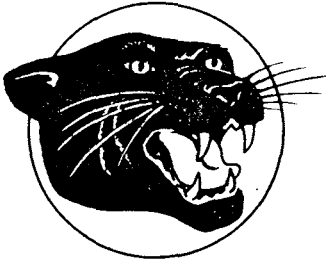

CHARLESTON, IL--Gigi MacIntosh (Mt. Zion) completed her career with the Eastern Illinois University women's softball team at the AIAW Division II College World Series, May 20-23 in Sioux Falls, SD.

The Panthers placed third in the WCWS and finished the season with a 45-8 record. It is the most wins in EIU history in any sport.

"Gigi was basically a two-year starter at first base for us and her fielding percentage (98% and just nine errors in two years) says it all," EIU coach Deanna D'Abbraccio said.

MacIntosh played 48 games at first, one in leftfield and one as the designated hitter. She set an EIU record with 381 putouts (379 at first base) and had 414 chances committing just seven errors.

MacIntosh hit .232 and was fourth in hits with 35. She was second to Mary Tieggs (Lake Bluff-Libertyville) in RBIs with 21. She was second in triples with four and was two for three in stolen bases.

A 1982 graduate in physical education, MacIntosh is a 1978 graduate of Mt. Zion High School where she played for coach Judy Wiggins.

MacIntosh is the daughter of Jim and Donna MacIntosh, R. R. #1, Macon.
