Minutes of July 20, 1972

I. Minutes of July 13, 1972 were approved.

II. ROTC

Vice-President Moody was present to discuss the possible application for the establishment of a voluntary Army ROTC program on Eastern's campus.

Wiseman reported on the Faculty vote:
ROTC Faculty vote-60 yes, 47 no

A motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Trank, to have a faculty referandum in late September on the question of whether or not Eastern should make application for an Army ROTC program. The motion failed with 3 yes, 9 no.

Lenihan reported on communications received on the subject of ROTC. Letters from R. Weidner, A. Aulabaugh, and L. Coon.

A motion was made by Doughty, seconded by Downs, that the Faculty Senate recommend that the University apply for an ROTC program which would be voluntary in nature. The motion passed with 7 yes, 6 no.
