## Appendix B

To the Faculty Senate:

I believe the Faculty Senate owes the whole faculty a public explanation. Why does the student evaluation of teachers continue when teacher evaluation of administrators has been discontinued? If student evaluation of teachers improves teacher performance, the same logic applies to improving administrative performance by teacher evaluation.

People commonly judge the abilities of other people by observing how these others work with them, the judges. Otherwise they rely upon the reports of others who work with them or who observe them. As society becomes more layered, it becomes more difficult for layers that make few contacts to judge each other. How can higher administrators truly judge lower administrators when they rarely see lower administrators work with the people below them? Not unless teachers report to the highest authorities will the president get the full picture of deans and department heads.

There is also the possibility that unscrupulous administrators will use student evaluations of teachers against faculty members in ways faculty members cannot defend against. The possibility of this was opened when the student evaluation committee began sending student evaluations of faculty to administrators instead of keeping them confidential with faculty as they first said they would.

The Faculty Senate needs to explain why it is a party to the present double standard as well as to the change in rules.
